

President's Report



For the 2020 newsletter, ever the optimist, I stated it had been an arduous year, but things were looking up! Sad to say we ended up with 260 days of lockdown in Melbourne over the course of the global pandemic. The Society was hit hard, but we have managed to run two meetings online. In 2020, I moved the in-person meeting that I was organising, online and we had excellent talks and discussions with members and colleagues in Australia and New Zealand, plus friends from further afield in Europe and South America.

Last year, we ran another meeting online. Originally this was to be organised as part of the FAOBMB meeting in Christchurch and combine our 10th joint meeting with SFRR Japan. This fell through with many places still in lockdown or unable to travel. We therefore converted to an

online meeting with "nodes" so people in the same area could meet in person, while interacting online. The further spread of covid stopped this from going exactly to plan but the show went on! Many thanks to Louisa Ashby, Stanley Chan, Jereme Spiers, Andrew Bulmer and others with organising this.

But now we are in 2022! We can finally meet in person in Christchurch for our 30th meeting and 10th Joint meeting with SFRR-Japan. I really look forward to seeing many friends and colleagues in Christchurch for what I think will be an outstanding event, and my last as president. I want to thank the organising committee led by Prof Tony Kettle for all their hard work. See you there!

President Elect's Update

2022 has been another challenging year, although I personally feel the uncertainty of the COVID pandemic, associated supply chain disruptions and challenges to conducting research are abating. For example, it is wonderful that the Society is returning to face-to-face meetings, in place of our informal COVID impacted on-line yearly meetings – what a great opportunity to re-connect with peers and catch-up on the research findings of the past 3 years!

I would very much like to thank Guy for navigating the Society through the 'COVID era', for organising our informal annual research meetings, and for continuing to navigate with Stanley the challenges of changing the Society's name (who thought it would be so complex and time consuming!). Thanks also to Louisa for

confidently stepping up to the plate as Secretary – we feel impeccably well organised and to Jereme for adding valuable insight into ECR perspectives and activities. It will be my pleasure to lead the Society in 2023 and continue on the good work of our past Presidents by raising the profile of the Society and our science domestically/overseas, instigating new ECR awards and making it easier to join and engage in Society activities. Finally, I'd like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a safe and relaxing festive period and a safe and prosperous New Year.

Treasurer's Update

The current financial position of the SFRRA remains relatively stable, despite the financial challenges imposed by COVID-19 since 2020. On the Australian side, the total assets of the Society currently sit around \$66K, which is \$6.5K gain from the same time of 2021. This is attributed to a combination of new memberships, membership renewals, and interest earned from term deposit, particularly in the recent months resulting from the interest rate rise by the federal reserve bank. Currently, the term deposit is on a month-to-month investment option which attracts an interest rate of 0.95% p.a. The SFRRA executive committee do have plans to switch to a slightly longer-term investment option (e.g. 3-month) which would attract interest rate of 3.2-4% p.a. On the banking front, the executive committee is seeking to move to a different financial institution (Westpac Bank) which offers a 2-step signatory

authorisation on transaction, instead of the simultaneous parallel authorisation (require both signatories logging onto the same computer) of CBA.

The finance of the NZ account is largely unchanged except the banking format is mainly online. The opening balance this year (NZD\$5,000) has permitted the Society to provide the advance float to the organising committee for the upcoming conference. On behalf of the Society and the conference organising committee, I would also like to thank the SFRR-Japan's sponsorship of the upcoming joint society conference 2022, at Christchurch.

ECR Representative's Update

It has been a challenging few years for ECRs with the lack of in-person conferences and meetings limiting exposure to potential supervisors and employers. At the upcoming meeting we will be aiming to promote engagement between senior researchers and ECRs looking for networking opportunities. We will also be reaching out during the in-person meeting, through the Society mailing list, and via the SFRRA Twitter account to consolidate our Society ECR mailing list and establish a mid-year ECR networking event.

Minutes from the 2021 Annual General Meeting



Friday 3rd December 2021– at the online annual meeting via Zoom, attended by multiple individual logins (up to 28) as well as congregated groups in Dunedin (4 people), Christchurch (14) and Gold Coast (6).

AGM opened 1:15pm (NZ time)

1. President's report

Brief recap of recent SFRRA annual meetings – the last in-person conference was in Sydney in 2019 (forest fires in the region), last year was the first online-format conference due to the COVID pandemic, and was organised by Melbourne. This year the original plans were for SFRRA 2021 to co-join the FAOBMB conference in Christchurch together with the SFRR Japan, but due to the ongoing pandemic, an online format for a more informal SFRRA annual meeting 2021 was adopted.

Three discussion points for today:

(a) Awards

The executive committee has started reviewing the SFRRA awards. Currently the major award is for Distinguished Service. The plan is to consider introducing new awards with an interest to support and recognise early/mid-career researchers.

(b) Online banking

The current online banking offered by Commonwealth Bank in Australia is proving difficult as two signatories are still required to be together in-person. The plan is to open an account at Westpac (online) to help with this problem.

(c) Plans for SFRRA 2022 meeting

Discussion opened with recognition that although an in-person conference is desirable, an online option may have to be opted for at short notice, as illustrated by the current emergence of new Omicron variant of COVID.

- -Tony Kettle offered Christchurch to organise and host the SFRRA 2022 conference, with the intention to start planning as a combined online and in-person format. Liz Ledgerwood pointed out that next year should be the 10th SFRRA&J joint meeting. Paul Witting offered to coordinate Australia (East Coast) for the online aspect of the meeting. Paul also indicated that Adelaide may be worth exploring as a new host in the near future too.
- -Andrew Bulmer raised the idea of considering alternative "off-site", or new locations, not previously used for SFRRA meetings, eg: Hobart, Cairns. Greg Anderson agreed that exotic locations can work for conferences (eg: BioIron planned for Darwin Aug 2023) but it helps to have local university people involved.
- -Guy Jameson wrapped up the discussions with an unopposed summary that the plan is:
- 2022 SFRRA&J joint societies scientific meeting hosted by Christchurch
- 2023 Paul to initiate discussions next year with Adelaide as a possible location for SFRRA 2023.

Future plans for an exotic location remain open for further discussion.

2. Treasurer's report

Stanley Chan presented his report with Powerpoint slides. All accounts are paid, otherwise there has been minimal activity in the three SFRRA accounts (cheque account and term deposit in Australia, and cheque account in NZ) due to not having an in-person conference and waiving membership fees. Taylor & Francis and MDPI sponsorships are in the process of being sorted out for continuation into next year. SFRRA membership going forward requires addressing the fees situation.

- -Greg Giles commented that the term deposit gain was low it was pointed out that interest rates currently are generally low everywhere.
- -Andrew Bulmer moved that current SFRRA membership status is rolled over for 2021 to 2022, and that a call for membership fee payment will be resumed for the Christchurch conference 2022. Seconded: Guy Jameson. Unopposed.
- -Discussion continued about increasing the money that is put towards travel awards, invitations to international speakers. Liz Ledgerwood pointed out that sponsorship can also be used for student prizes and plenary speaker travel costs.
- -Guy Jameson moved that the Treasurer's Report is accepted including up to \$5000 to be used for travel awards for the SFRRA 2022 conference, with final approval to be given by the executive committee. Seconded: Liz Ledgerwood. Unopposed.

3. Secretary's report

Not required in 2021.

4. Election of SFRRA Executive officers

Not required in 2021.

5. General Business

To facilitate SFRRA banking processes, additional signatories are required.
